Christ Jesus on the shore of Galilee and the Morning Meal

Christian Scientist commemorate the morning meal on the shore of Galilee by reading the *Lesson Sermon* that can be found in the *Christian Science Quarterly - Citation Edition*. It is best to read it from the books *Science and Health with Key to the Scripture* and *The King James Bible* that have been marked because the books presents the complete story even though only a portion may be marked. (See Marking Books) To read from any other so called Quarterly (full text) is not in accord with what Mrs. Eddy says about reading from Manuscripts (Misc. 315:6) "No copies from my books are allowed to be written, and read from manuscripts, either in private or in public assemblies, except by their author."

Mrs. Eddy wrote in *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* (34:29-35:18) "What a contrast between our Lord's last supper and his last spiritual breakfast with his disciples in the bright morning hours at the joyful meeting on the shore of the Galilean Sea! His gloom had passed into glory, and his disciples' grief into repentance, — hearts chastened and pride rebuked. Convinced of the fruitlessness of their toil in the dark and awakened by their Master's voice, they changed their methods, turned away from material things, and cast their net on the right side. Discerning Christ, Truth, anew on the shore of time, they were enabled to rise somewhat from mortal sensuousness, or the burial of mind in matter, into newness of life as Spirit.

This spiritual meeting with our Lord in the dawn of a new light is the morning meal which Christian Scientists commemorate. They bow before Christ, Truth, to receive more of his reappearing and silently to commune with the divine Principle, Love. They celebrate their Lord's victory over death, his probation in the flesh after death, its exemplification of human probation, and his spiritual and final ascension above matter, or the flesh,"

John 21:12-18 The Morning Meal Bible Story from The King James Bible

"Jesus saith unto them, Come and dine. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.

Jesus then cometh, and taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise.

This is now the third time that Jesus shewed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.
